



# JESUS DID IT ALL!

Jesus redeemed us from poverty and lack!

March 10, 2024 – Part 5

Isaiah 53 <sup>4</sup> Yet he was the one who carried our sicknesses and endured the torment of our sufferings. We viewed him as one who was being punished for something he himself had done, as one who was struck down by God and brought low. <sup>5</sup> But it was because of our rebellious deeds that he was pierced and because of our sins that he was crushed. He endured the punishment that made us completely whole... TPT

2 Corinthians 5 <sup>21</sup> For God made the only one who did not know sin to become sin for us, so that we might become the righteousness of God through our union with him. TPT

Galatians 3 <sup>13</sup> Yet, Christ paid the full price to set us free from the curse of the law. He absorbed the curse completely as he became a curse in our place. For it is written: "Everyone who is hung upon a tree is cursed." <sup>14</sup> Jesus Christ dissolved the curse from our lives, so that in him all the blessings of Abraham can be poured out upon gentiles. And now through faith we receive the promised Holy Spirit *who lives in us.* TPT

2 Corinthians 8 <sup>9</sup> For you have experienced the extravagant grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that although he was infinitely rich, he impoverished himself for our sake, so that by his poverty, we become rich beyond measure. TPT

Proverbs 10 <sup>22</sup> The blessing of the Lord makes a person rich, and he adds no sorrow with it. NLT

Proverbs 13 <sup>22</sup> The benevolent man leaves an inheritance that endures to his children's children, but the wealth of the wicked is treasured up for the righteous. TPT

Psalms 112 <sup>1</sup> Shout in celebration of praise to the Lord! Everyone who loves the Lord and delights in him will cherish his words and be blessed beyond expectation. <sup>2</sup> Their descendants will be prosperous and influential. Every generation of the righteous will experience his favor. <sup>3</sup> Great blessing and wealth fills the house of the wise, for their integrity endures forever. <sup>4</sup> Even if darkness overtakes them, sunrise-brilliance will come bursting through because they are gracious to others, so tender and true. <sup>5</sup> Life is good for the one who is generous and charitable, conducting affairs with honesty and truth. <sup>6</sup> Their circumstances will never shake them and others will never forget their example. <sup>7</sup> They will not live in fear or dread of what may come, for their hearts are firm, ever secure in their faith. <sup>8</sup> Steady and strong, they will not be afraid, but will calmly face their every foe until they all go down in defeat. <sup>9</sup> Never stingy and always generous to those in need, they lived lives of influence and honor that will never be forgotten, for they were full of good deeds. TPT

Deuteronomy 8 <sup>1</sup> "Every commandment that I am commanding you today you shall be careful to do, so that you may live and multiply, and go in and possess the land which the Lord swore [to give] to your fathers. <sup>2</sup> And you shall remember [always] all the ways which the Lord your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, so that He might humble you and test you, to know what was in your heart (mind), whether you would keep His commandments or not. <sup>3</sup> He humbled you and allowed you to be hungry and fed you with manna, [a substance] which you did not know, nor did your fathers know, so that He might make you understand [by personal experience] that man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that proceeds out of the mouth of the Lord. <sup>4</sup>

**Your clothing did not wear out on you, nor did your feet swell these forty years.** <sup>5</sup> **Therefore, know in your heart (be fully cognizant) that the Lord your God disciplines and instructs you just as a man disciplines and instructs his son.** <sup>6</sup> Therefore, you shall keep the commandments of the Lord your God, to walk [that is, to live each and every day] in His ways and fear [and worship] Him [with awe-filled reverence and profound respect]. <sup>7</sup> **For the Lord your God is bringing you into a good land,** a land of brooks of water, of fountains and springs, flowing forth in valleys and hills; <sup>8</sup> **a land of wheat and barley, and vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive oil and honey;** <sup>9</sup> **a land where you will eat bread without shortage, in which you will lack nothing;** a land whose stones are iron, and out of whose hills you can dig copper. <sup>10</sup> **When you have eaten and are satisfied, then you shall bless the Lord your God for the good land which He has given you.** <sup>11</sup> **Beware that you do not forget the Lord your God** by failing to keep His commandments and His judgments (precepts) and His statutes which I am commanding you today; <sup>12</sup> **otherwise, when you have eaten and are satisfied, and have built good houses and lived in them,** <sup>13</sup> **and when your herds and flocks multiply, and your silver and gold multiply, and all that you have increases,** <sup>14</sup> **then your heart will become lifted up [by self-conceit and arrogance] and you will forget the Lord your God who brought you from the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.** <sup>15</sup> He led you through the great and terrible wilderness, *with its* fiery serpents and scorpions and thirsty ground where there was no water; it was He who brought water for you out of the flinty rock. <sup>16</sup> He fed you manna in the wilderness, [a substance] which your fathers did not know, **so that He might humble you [by dependence on Him] and that He might test you, to do good [things] for you at the end.** <sup>17</sup> **Otherwise, you may say in your heart, 'My power and the strength of my hand made me this wealth.'** <sup>18</sup> **But you shall remember [with profound respect] the Lord your God, for it is He who is giving you power to make wealth, that He may confirm His covenant which He swore (solemnly promised) to your fathers, as it is this day.** AMP

**Isaiah 48** <sup>17</sup> This is what Yahweh, your Kinsman-Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel says: **"I am Yahweh, your God. I am the One who teaches you how to succeed and who leads you step by step in the way you should go.** TPT

**Isaiah 48** <sup>17</sup> This is what the Lord, your Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel says, **"I am the Lord your God, who teaches you to profit (benefit),** Who leads you in the way that you should go. <sup>18</sup> Oh, that you had paid attention to My commandments! **Then your peace and prosperity would have been like a [flowing] river,** And your righteousness [the holiness and purity of the nation] like the [abundant] waves of the sea. AMP

**Isaiah 43** <sup>4</sup> **Since you are cherished and precious in my eyes, and because I love you dearly and want to honor you,** I willingly give up nations in exchange for you—a man to save your life. ...

<sup>7</sup> **Bring me everyone who is called by my name, the ones I created to experience my glory. I myself formed them to be who they are and made them for my glory."**

**Note: vs 4** This is the Hebrew word for "glory" (honor)

**Glory:** *chabod* (kah-vohd); Strong's #3519: Weightiness; that which is substantial or heavy; glory, honor, splendor, power, wealth, authority, magnificence, fame, dignity, riches, and excellency. The root of *chabod* is *chabad*, "to be heavy, glorious, notable," or "to be renowned." In the OT, "heaviness" represented honor and substance, while "lightness" was equated with vanity, instability, temporariness, and emptiness. *Chabod* is God's glory, not only His honor, renown, and majesty, but also His visible splendor, which filled Solomon's temple and will someday fill the Earth. From *chabod* are derived the names "Jochebed" ("Yahweh Is Glory") and Ichabod ("Where Is the Glory?").
