Treasure of Jesus

My purpose is that they may be encouraged in heart and united in love, so that they may have the full riches of complete understanding, in order that they may know the mystery of God, namely, Christ, in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. Colossians 2:2-3 (NIV)

The One that alone satisfies – The Treasure of Jesus. It doesn't sound like a typical Thanksgiving passage, does it? In fact, this passage from Paul's letter to the Colossians doesn't appear to mention a single thing about giving thanks, nor does it appear to mention anything about the earthly blessings we've received. Or does it?

As you may know, throughout the course of the year we set aside "seasons" in order to focus on God's redemptive work for us in Christ; and, year after year, Thanksgiving is added to the mix – falling near the end of one Church year calendar while ushering in the beginning of another. What most people may not realize is that, because Thanksgiving is a "national" holiday (celebrated by Americans), it's never been considered a part of our liturgical Church year.

It's not that the universal Church is anti-Thanksgiving; rather, the Church year is focused on the redemptive work of Christ and therefore takes us on a journey that begins with our Lord's first Advent. This, then, ultimately leads us to the cross, empty tomb, and right on into the season of the Holy Spirit (Pentecost). Simply put...the Church year is about God's plan of salvation revealed in and through Christ Jesus.

I have to admit that I love the fact that, as American Christians, we have added Thanksgiving to our worship calendar where, year after year, our celebration falls at the culmination of one journey with Christ and the beginning of yet another. Perfectly positioned at a point where we celebrate the Kingship and anticipated return of our Lord (His

second Advent) and the beginning of yet another year with the incarnation of Christ (His first Advent), Thanksgiving helps to keep our focus on the Treasure that Jesus is and the treasures He gives.

After all, the Treasure of Christ includes the treasure of forgiveness, the treasure of mercy, and therefore the treasure of salvation for people like us (who were once considered fallen, hopeless, and destined for eternal despair)...and Thanksgiving (whether or not you think it should be a part of the liturgical Church year) is perfectly placed to remind us of all that we have to be truly thankful for – including the new lives we've been given in and through the Treasure of our crucified, risen, and ascended Lord Jesus Christ.

Likewise, I pray that the Holy Spirit leads you to share these treasures with those around you...especially **the treasure of Jesus**.

Now Thank We All Our God

Let them thank the Lord for his steadfast love, for his wondrous works to the children of man! And let them offer sacrifices of thanksgiving, and tell of his deeds in songs of joy! Psalm 107:21-22

Greetings in Christ!


One of the beloved hymns of the Lutheran tradition that we sing at Thanksgiving is LSB 895 "Now Thank We All Our God." It is based on a passage in the apocryphal book of Ecclesiasticus (50:22), which is a part of the Apocrypha- 14 books of writings produced in the 400 years between the Old Testament and the New Testament. While we do not hold these books on the level of Scripture, Lutherans have used the writings for instruction and devotion for ages. Luther is quoted as writing: "These books are not held equal to the Scriptures, but are useful and good to read." The passage of Ecclesiasticus 50:22 reads, "And now bless the God of all, who in every way does great things; who exalts our days from birth and deals with us according to His mercy. May He give us gladness of heart and grant that peace may be in our days in Israel, as in the days of old. May He entrust to us His mercy! And let Him deliver us in our days!"

Martin Rinckart, born in 1586, is the author of this hymn. He served as archdeacon in his hometown of Eilenburg, Germany, and his pastoral service coincided with the Thirty Years' War (1618-48). During this time, a plague struck, resulting in the death of 8,000 residents including Rinckart's wife, Christine. That year, he officiated over 4,000 funerals and had to take on the duties of two other Lutheran parishes in Eilenburg. Following this plague, severe famine struck. Rinckart organized assistance and even purchased grain for the hungry out of his own funds. Through the many burdens he and his family faced, Rinckart never lost his faith and trust in God. He wore a signet ring inscribed with a single word- MVSICA. Rinckart was also a musician and Lutheran cantor, so it is no surprise that he wore a ring with the word "musica" engraved on it. Yet, this word also was explained by Rinckart as abbreviating the sentence "my trust is in Christ alone" (in German). His hymn "Now Thank We All Our God" displays this unwavering trust in God.

"Now Thank We All Our God" was first published in 1636, and was written as a mealtime prayer. A handwritten manuscript which Rinckart gave to his children in 1630 actually survived until the nineteenth century, but has been lost. Ultimately, it became a well-known hymn and has been incorporated into hymnals of numerous other church bodies.

As we approach another national day of Thanksgiving, we do so with joyful hearts, as God is merciful to us and will guide us and free us from "all ills in this world and the next."







Luke 52 Project Clinic and Selah's Red Tent

Recently, the St. Peter Life Team learned about two compassionate non-profit organizations, Luke 52 Project Clinic and Selah's Red Tent Initiative, through the eyes of a volunteer, Jen Kosakowski, who is also a member of our congregation. The Luke 52 Project Clinic, located in Flint, Michigan, is an all-volunteer Christian organization dedicated to helping pregnant women in need as they approach the birth of their child up until their child is 1 year old.
