Greetings in Christ!

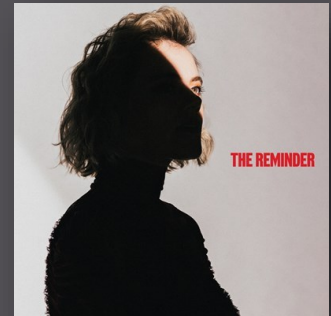
Why do we sing? This is one of the first questions I asked of you in the monthly Keynotes after I arrived at St. Peter nearly four years ago. This is a question we must continue to answer: why do we devote so much time in worship to singing? After all, singing is one of those things that sometimes makes us uncomfortable, especially if doing it alone. We sing when something important happens: we sing as we comfort our children and rock them to sleep, we sing to people on their birthdays, or perhaps we join together in song at a football game. We sing at the important moments of our lives. For us as Christians, we live these important moments weekly as we receive God in the Divine Service. We come from our weekly lives, joining together in this community, to receive God where He has promised to be. As we are nourished by His holy Word and Sacrament, we sing and sing again of what He has done for us.

One hymn among many that strikes at the heart of why we sing is LSB 819 "Sing Praise to God, the Highest Good," which we will sing as the opening hymn the weekend of June 6 and 7. The first stanza reminds us that God is the greatest good, the author of all creation who understood from the beginning our need for salvation. He provides us with the balm for all of our woes, and we give Him praise and glory for this. The subsequent stanzas speak of how God continues to care for us and all of creation, especially how He has heard our plea and came to earth to suffer, to die, and to rise triumphantly as victor over sin, death, and the devil. The hymnwriter finally leaves us with a plea- that all who confess Christ's name might give Him praise and glory, and continue to tell of this wondrous story.

As I prepare to conclude my service here at St. Peter, my prayer is that you continue to sing boldly and confidently of all of the wondrous works of our Lord. It has been such a blessing to worship with you each week, to serve with so many of you in our choirs and other musical groups, to see you in the hallways of our school, and to walk through life together with you. We will always remember St. Peter warmly, most especially since this is the church and community where we welcomed Miriam into our family. We pray that the Lord would continue to guide, bless and sustain you. Until we meet again, sing boldly!

HISTORY CORNER



It is important to remember that St. Peter History is not meant to show how great St. Peter is, but how amazing God is as He works through His Word and Sacraments among us. History is His story. Our History is a Ministry that proclaims His great deeds to future generations.



In 1960, 13.5 acres were bought from Louis Wangelin in anticipation of future growth. Mr. Joa Penzien was appointed to plan our future needs. On Easter morning of 1961, Pastor Paul Weber led the ground breaking ceremony for a new four-room school. Pastor Calvin Harm, in his first year at St. Peter, dedicated the school on August 19, 1962, with Pastor Weber as the guest speaker. This new school was the beginning of our current church and school campus that now covers 41 acres on the northwest corner of 24 Mile and Romeo Plank roads.

The school had four classrooms for two grades in each room, a workroom, an office area, a library, and a first aid room. The cost of the building was \$130,000. Teacher Christian Kaiser, who taught at the red brick school, became its first principal and taught the upper grades. Mr. Leslie Northrop, who taught at the Macomb Corners school, taught the middle grades. Miss Barbara Barli taught the lower grades. A fourth teacher was later added. Mr. Northrop became the second principal and still taught in 1966. He was succeeded by Mr. George Roggatz two years later. Both Teacher Kaiser and Mr. Northrop were also our church organists.

Many individuals and groups unselfishly gave their time, talents, and offerings so this new school would be dedicated to the Glory of God.
