By extension, when young people thrive, the lands and waters on which they live thrive, their communities thrive, and the world thrives. This is good work. It is work that matters. WHO WE ARE

College Horizons (CH) is a national non-profit organization based in New Mexico located on the homelands of the Pueblo people. CH was founded in 1998 at the Native American Preparatory School (in New Mexico) initially serving Native students in the southwest and **today has grown to serve over 4,000 Indigenous students nation-wide** representing over 300 Tribal Nations, villages of Alaska and islands of Hawai'i. In addition, CH has provided professional development training to 1,000 college admission officers (from 100 colleges), high school counselors and Tribal educators.



The mission of College Horizons is to encourage and facilitate the higher education of Native American young people by providing college access, college retention, and pre-graduate programs. College Horizons was founded over 20 years ago because Native American students were not receiving sufficient and quality college advising, academic advising and financial aid counseling in their high schools resulting in Native students either being under-matched or not accessing 4-year degree programs at all.

Our goal is to:

1. **Increase the higher education of American Indian, Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian high school and college students** by providing pre-college (College Horizons) and pre-graduate (Graduate Horizons) admission/financial aid counseling programs and,
2. **Increase Native student well being and college completion rate** by providing a college success program for alumni (Scholars Program)

College Horizons was created to address the college attainment gap of Native students.

We want Native students to attend college as their full selves -
bring their culture, language, ancestors and Indigenous ways of knowing with them
because these are gifts, blessings and educational assets.



OUR STUDENT IMPACT

99% of College Horizons alumni graduate from high school, 95% matriculate directly to a 4-year institution with 5% to community college or Tribal College. According to third-party verification, **85% of our students graduate college within 4-6 years** and our students have graduated from 700 colleges/universities.

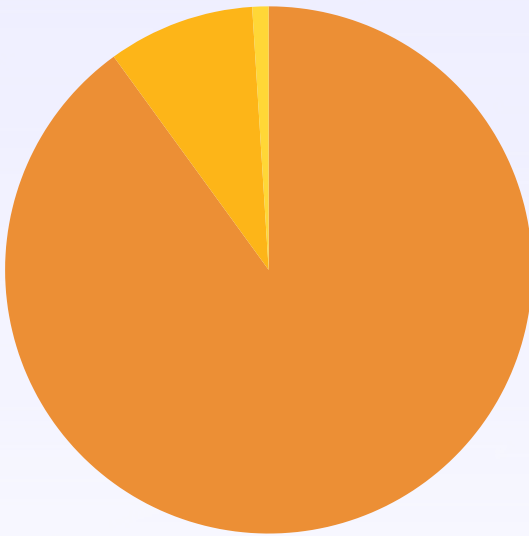
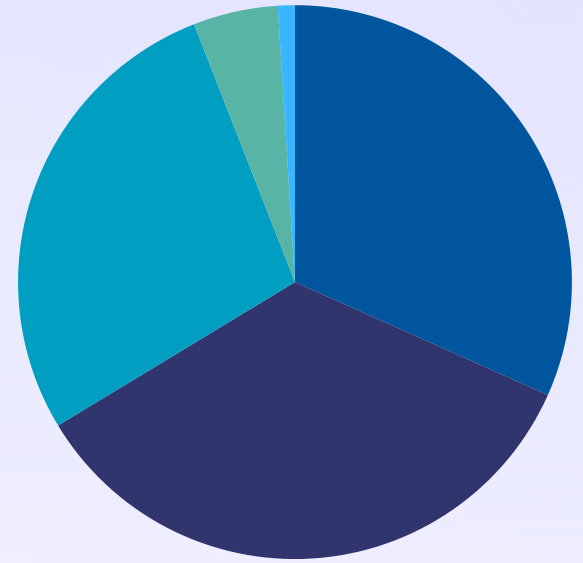
