The purpose of the Associate in Applied Science in Applied Technology – Military Services Option is to provide an avenue through which members of the Armed Forces may apply experiential training earned while on active duty within one of the branches of the U.S. Military toward degree completion.

Students will be requested to provide an official transcript from their respective branch of service.

NOC evaluates students for placement into either foundational or college-level courses, whichever will lead to the greatest possibility of student success. Academic placement is determined either by A.C.T. test scores or by Accuplacer test scores. These tests are administered in the Testing Center at NOC. Based upon the scores, students may be required to take one or more courses for remediation in English, Math, or Reading, either prior to or concurrent with credit courses.
