Emma Valgora, Mia-Claire Jones crowned Miss NOC

Winners of the dual Miss Northern Oklahoma College Scholarship Competition held at NOC Tonkawa Oct. 26 were Mia-Claire Jones, Miss NOC Enid 2022 and Emma Valgora, Miss NOC Tonkawa 2022.

They were crowned, respectively, by Miss NOC Enid 2020-21 Emily Hall, Enid, and by Miss NOC Tonkawa 2020-21 Carli Pendleton, Tonkawa.

Each received a \$1000 scholarship expense award, Miss America crown and pin, sash and a bouquet of long-stemmed red roses. They will advance to the Miss Oklahoma Scholarship Pageant in Tulsa next June, according to pageant co-directors Terri Sunderland, NOC Enid, and Shannon Varner, NOC Tonkawa.

The new Miss NOC Enid is a sophomore majoring in pre-medicine. She performed "Canon in D" by Pachelbel on the piano. Her Social Impact Statement was "Adoption: Helping to Build Families."

Miss NOC Tonkawa 2022 is a freshman majoring in music theatre. She is the daughter of Jill Valgora of Ponca City. Her talent was "O mio babbino caro" by Giacomo Puccini. Her Social Impact Statement was "Pause. Provide. Prevent. Ending the Stigma to Prevent Suicide." First runners-up to NOC Tonkawa was Chandler Brown, Ponca City. She received a \$600 scholarship expense award.

Second runner-up to Miss NOC Tonkawa was Makayla Seeney, Kingston, Oklahoma who received a \$400 scholarship expense award.

Others vying for the title of Miss NOC Enid were Carina Ramirez, Garber, and Kaylyn Marr, Enid. Others in the Miss Tonkawa Scholarship Competition were Addison Doyen, Tonkawa; Mikayla Kraus, Okarche; Mariah Moberly, Oklahoma City; Regan Clapper, Pawnee; Stephanie Henry, Ponca City; and Hannah Haley, Tonkawa. Each received a \$250 tuition waiver participation award.

Candidates were judged in artistic expression, presence and poise in evening wear and on-stage question. Earlier in the day they were individually interviewed by the judges.

Dr. Edward Dixon, NOC Fine Arts Division chair, served as master of ceremonies for the evening. Miss Oklahoma 2021 Ashleigh Robinson performed for the audience.

Special entertainment was by Miss NOC Tonkawa 202-21, singing "Journey to the Past." Miss NOC Enid sang, "How Great Thou Art."

Escorting the Miss NOC 2020-21 royalty as they made their farewell walks were Oklahoma Stars Makenna Fischer with Miss Hall. Miss Pendleton's Stars Amara Anderson and London Anderson of Muskogee were not able to attend.

The NOC Men's and Women's soccer teams travel to Enid for NJCAA Region 2 Soccer this week.

The #15 Women's team shut out NEO Thursday 3-0 and face Seminole at 6 p.m. in the semi-finals.

The men beat Eastern 3-0 and advance to Saturday's final against the Eastern/Rich Mountain winner.

NOC's men (12-3-2, 9-1-2 in conference) are led by Damorney Hutchinson, a sophomore

from Soho, Jamaica. He is second in the nation with 27 goals this season. Marcovich Brown, a sophomore from Gregory Park, Jamaica, is third in the nation in assists with 13.

NOC's women (14-3, 12-3 in conference) are led by Milica Bulatovic, a sophomore from Prokuplje, Serbia. She is third in the nation with 24 goals.

The games are at Enid High School. The women's final is set for 3:30 p.m. Saturday, the men's final is set for 1 p.m.

The 2021-22 NOC Lady Mavs

Lady Mavs open season Monday

The Northern Oklahoma College Lady Mavs open the 2021-22 season Monday night hosting Cloud County (KS) at 5:30 p.m. in Foster-Piper Fieldhouse.

Coach Greg Krause starts his 39th season at the helm, Krause has won 605 games as the Lady Mavs’ head coach.

NOC returns three from their 2021 squad including guards Delaney Reimer and Morgan Livesay, and forward Travisha Cogdell.

“It’s a good sophomore group,” Krause said. “They have worked hard and we’re counting on them to lead this year’s team.”

Other sophomores but new to the Lady Mavs program are Amaya Chandler, Alena Sly, and Addie Trent.

Incoming freshman include Jatalyah Williams, Shelby Rayner, Jordan Holman, Morgan Hawkins, Lexie Boyer, Tracy Ikwumere, and Makhia Fernandez.

“We’re excited about this freshman group,” Krause said. “They have shown good things

in practice and in our scrimmages. They have come along to the point where I think we can be a deeper team this season.”

Riemer, a sophomore from Sentinel, Oklahoma, was a double figure scorer in 2021 and Krause is counting on her to lead the Lady Mavs’ offense.

“Delaney is just a solid player,” Krause said. “She does so many things well.”

Shelby Rayner, a freshman guard from Tasmania, is a transfer that has played well in scrimmages.

“She is a gifted scorer that can create for other players,” Krause said. “She is an aggressive player that is very physical.”

I think we’ll have a lot of options offensively,” Krause said. “We have a chance to be more balanced than years past.”

“We’ll see how the pieces fit,” Krause added. “That’s always a challenge to find the right combinations for what we want to do offensively and defensively.”

Mavs open season at home Monday

The Northern Oklahoma College Mavericks open the 2021-22 season Monday, Nov. 1 against Labette in the Foster-Piper Fieldhouse. NOC is under the direction of Brad Witherspoon who starts his first season as the Mavs' head coach. Witherspoon was an assistant at Barton County (KS) before coming to NOC. The Mavs return sophomores Syrus Grisby, DJ Alexander, and Jaylin Oliver from last year's Elite Eight but it left a number of holes to fill on the 2021-22 roster. "That was a big challenge," he said. "But fortunately, we were able to put together a good group. I'm excited about how they have worked and how they've played." Other sophomores include Elijah Pickens, Drake Montgomery, Jalen Johnson, Stevie Davis, and Cam Malray. Freshmen include Nick Cham, DJ Jones, Fede Federiko, David Owusu, Chad Milne, Kodee Holloway, and Naadhir Wood. "The main thing we have stressed is just buying into NOC," Witherspoon said. "Playing for your teammates, playing for each other, and the

school you represent. If we can do that, I think this group has a lot of potential." Witherspoon said he thinks he'll be able to play a lot of players in 2021-22. "I think we can be a deep team," he said. I think we have a number of guys that can contribute. It's just guys buying in and playing their roles." Grisby, a 6-8 sophomore from Luther, Oklahoma, was a key player in the Mavs' success the past two seasons. Guards DJ Alexander and Jaylin Oliver hope to contribute as well. Newcomers include Fede Federiko, a 6-11 post from Finland. Cam Malray is another post player that Witherspoon is counting on this season. Guards include DJ Jones, Elijah Pickens, Drake Montgomery, Kodee Holloway, and David Owusu. "It's going to take some time for us to find the right combinations but I think we will," he said. "I'm just excited to get going." Witherspoon replaced Donnie Jackson who took the Cowley (KS) position this summer.
