Mavs open play Tuesday in the NJCAA Men's Tournament

The Northern Oklahoma College Mavericks open play in the NJCAA Tournament in Hutchinson, Kansas, Tuesday at 6:30 p.m. in the Hutchinson Sports Arena.

The Mavs (23-1) are the #2 seed in the tournament, they face the #15 Vincennes/#18 Holmes winner on Tuesday. Vincennes (17-6) and Holmes (15-3) play their first-round game Monday at 2 p.m. Vincennes was ranked #20 in the final NJCAA poll.

"We are so excited," said head coach Donnie Jackson. "It's a great experience for our players and great for NOC."

The Mavs qualified as an at-large team in 2020 but the tournament was canceled due to COVID-19.

Could the Mavs make it back in 2021?

"That was something we talked a lot about," Jackson said. "Last year was sort of left unfinished. I think it says a lot for these players to be even more determined to make it this year after qualifying but not getting to play last year."

Mav players had no doubt.

"We had no choice but to make it back," said NJCAA Region 2 Tournament MVP J.D. Ray. "That was our plan all along."

"We had what we needed to make it back," said 3rd Team All-Conference forward Avante Lederer. "We knew we could do it, we just had to make it happen."

deep run in Hutchinson next week?

"Defense," said OCAC Player of the Year Tyrel Morgan.

"We are a better defensive team than last year," Jackson added. "And I think we have played better under pressure, we've had a lot of close games this year where we had to make plays late to win games and we have done that. I think that will help us next week at Hutch."

Although the Mavs have accomplished plenty in 2021 winning the OCAC and Region 2 Tour-

nement, the players are not satisfied.

“We definitely have unfinished business,” Ray said.

“We’ve had good days of practice and we’ll be ready to go on Tuesday,” Jackson said.

“This was such a hard year for everyone,” Jackson said. “We had quarantines and extended periods where we couldn’t practice and then once we started playing we had cancellations and then played a ton of games in a short period. It’s a testament to these kids that they

overcame all that to play in the national tournament.”

If the Mavs win Tuesday, they advance to the Elite 8 Thursday at 2 p.m. The Final Four is set for Friday at 7 p.m., the National Championship Game is at 6 p.m. Saturday.

The Mavs have won 12 straight since their lone loss to NOC Enid on March 11.

NOC was ranked 7th in the final NJCAA poll.

This is the fourth trip to the NJCAA National Tournament for the Mavs.

Mavs beat Jets in classic, win Region 2 Tournament

ENID, Oklahoma -- The NOC Mavs earned their second straight trip to the NJCAA National Championships with a thrilling 66-64 win over NOC Enid Saturday at the Stride Bank Center.

The Mavs (23-1) completed the sweep winning the OCAC regular season crown and the Region 2 Tournament.

NOC also avenged an earlier 66-62 loss to NOC Enid, the only loss of the season for the 7th ranked Mavs. Saturday's game was also the first time that any two NOC programs have com-peted in the championship game of the Region 2 Tournament in the same year. The Mavs have now won 12 straight.

JD Ray led the Mavs with 24 points while Tyrel Morgan added 18, and Nate Goodlow 11.

"What a game," said Mavs coach Donnie Jackson. "That is what a region championship game should look like. Both teams battled hard and competed. Very excited we punched our ticket to Hutch."

"I'm really excited for the guys," Jackson added. "We overcome a couple of deficits and found a way to win. They deserve the opportunity to represent Region 2 at the National tournament. This has been a special group of sophomores and I want to keep it going for as long as we can."

Saturday's game was close as close can be as the Mavs led the majority of the first half but after the Jets took a late lead, Goodlow drilled a 3-pointer with :10 left to give the Mavs a 35-34 lead at the break.

The second half saw four ties and eight lead changes with a short Morgan jumper giving the Mavs a 58-57 lead they would not relinquish.

Morgan's jumper started a 7-2 run with the

Mavs leading 65-59 with 1:39 left.

The Jets hung around as a Teyan Scanlan 3-pointer and a Quinten Harvey layup cut the lead to 65-64 with :49.2 left.

Ray then hit one of two at the line to give the Mavs a 66-64 lead.

The Jets had one last opportunity but Andrew O'Brien's 3-pointer was off the mark at the buzzer.

Morgan and Ray combined for 11 of the Mavs' final 13 points in the last 7:00.

Ray was named the All-Tournament MVP while Morgan and Avante Lederer were also named to the all-tourney team.

The NJCAA National Tournament runs April 19-24.

The Jets finished the year at 17-5.
