A minimum of 60 hours must be taken at a baccalaureate granting institution, so exceeding 64 credit hours at the community college means the student will exceed the minimum of 124 credit hour total. A minimum of 40 hours of 3/4000 level courses are required for the baccalaureate. Courses from community colleges are 1/2000 level.
