

NOCF Lectureship Series Hosts Private Screening of *Killers of the Flower Moon* in Ponca City



Northern Oklahoma College and the Renfro Endowed Lectureship Series presented a private screening of the Martin Scorsese's film, "Killers of the Flower Moon," Wednesday, Oct. 18 at the historic Poncan Theatre in Ponca City.

The private, invitation-only screening was made possible by the Renfro Family Foundation, Northern Oklahoma College and the Northern Oklahoma College Foundation. Over 700 attended the event.

Before the event, NOC Vice President for Development and Community Relations Sheri Snyder, Carl Renfro, and President of the Poncan Theatre Company Luke

Garrison spoke to the full house at the Poncan Theatre.

"On behalf of Carl and Brenda Renfro and the Renfro Family Foundation along with Northern Oklahoma College and the NOC Foundation, we are so excited to provide today's screening and reception as a part of the Renfro Endowed Lectureship Program," Snyder said.

"The lectureship program was established in 2006 to provide cultural and community enrichment offerings in northern Oklahoma to include lectures or live performances on the campus of NOC Tonkawa or in the Ponca City area," she added. "Since its establishment, we have sponsored some amazing lectureships and concerts each year totaling 28 to date, with over 12,500 participants attending these highly popular events."

Snyder said that in October 2018, NOC hosted Author David Grann and a sold-out crowd of individuals including local, county, and state officials along with dignitaries from the Osage Nation and other tribal affiliations. It was that evening when Grann announced that his best-selling book "Killers of the Flower Moon: The Osage Murders and the Birth of the FBI" was going to be made into a movie.

Snyder invited Carl and Brenda to the stage to recognize and thank them for their generosity. "Five years later and over seven months of discussions, planning, persistence, negotiations, and a lot of sleepless nights, we are here today," she said. "This has been a great dream of Carl and Brenda to have this film shown in this historic Poncan Theatre and what a pleasure that all of you could join us today on this very special occasion."

WRESTLING IS OFFICIALLY BACK AT NOC, SCHOLARSHIP SUPPORT NEEDED.

College wrestling at Northern Oklahoma College is back. The reestablishing of the men's program and the start of a women's program for Fall 2024 is officially moving forward.

The NOC Regents approved re-establishing wrestling at NOC at the June 14 Board of Regents Meeting, Since that time, numerous fundraising initiatives are underway.

A fundraiser dinner was held at T.S. Fork in Tonkawa in September with Oklahoma State University Wrestling Coach John Smith and University of Central Oklahoma Coach Todd Steidley speaking at the event. In December, NOC partnered with the Tonkawa Takedown Club and hosted a very successful "Back on the Mat at NOC" OKWA youth wrestling tournament in the Foster-Piper Fieldhouse, NOC Tonkawa.

Currently, nearly \$200,000 has been raised towards the startup goal. The first fundraising phase is providing mats, uniforms, equipment, some travel and funding for a coaches' salary and benefits. The next fundraising phase will provide targeted funding directed towards scholarships for our student athletes.

NOC will continue to fundraise for the program with more events planned for this spring. The next event will be January 16 with NOC hosting the Blackwell/Tonkawa Dual on campus. Attendees will also get an opportunity to meet the new men's and women's coach who will head up the programs.

Alan Foster, NOC Athletic Director, said, "I am super excited to be a part of adding to the athletic offerings at NOC. I feel wrestling will provide opportunities for student athletes and give them another reason to attend NOC. I have also been really impressed and appreciative of the support from the community in this endeavor.

Todd Glasgow, Wrestling Fund Raising Community Liaison, said, "The return of wrestling to NOC has so many people pumped up with enthusiasm. We have so many people who have been generous with their time and money that we cannot thank them enough, nor are we done fundraising either. I am excited to see the future men and women's teams compete in the Fall of 2024. We are so excited this is happening. Go Mavs!"


