Water Department Addresses Water Breaks

We truly appreciate the community’s patience during the outage and subsequent boil order.

In February, the Village experienced two major watermain breaks. The first was at 8th and Washington Streets, and the second was at 12th and Rutledge Streets. Both were due to ground shifting during freeze-thaw cycles.

The larger break at 8th and Washington occurred at a cross-section, and the entire cross had to be replaced. It was a 16-hour project that required significant excavation and careful repair. Our team worked steadily to isolate the damaged section, make the repair, and restore service as quickly and safely as possible.

This section of the watermain at 8th and Main is part of an area that the Village is actively working to replace. The line was originally installed in the 1940s and is made of cast iron. While age is certainly a factor, cast iron pipe is more rigid and can be more susceptible to cracking during freeze-thaw cycles and ground movement compared to newer materials. While excavating, crews even uncovered an old horseshoe — a small reminder of how long this infrastructure has been in the ground.

Keeping Pawnee Running: Meet the Gas & Water Department Team

Behind the scenes of everyday life in Pawnee is a dedicated team that works hard to ensure residents have safe drinking water and reliable natural gas service. The Village of Pawnee Gas and Water Department is staffed by skilled employees who respond to emergencies, maintain infrastructure, and plan improvements to keep the community running smoothly. Three key team members—**Andrew Lee, Josh McElroy, and Brandon Jackson**—play an important role in maintaining and improving these essential services.

Serving the Community—Day and Night

In addition to their regular duties, the team participates in a weekly on-call rotation to respond to after-hours gas and water emergencies. Whether it’s a water main break, a gas odor report, or another urgent issue, the team is always ready to respond. Through their dedication, training, and commitment to the community, the Village of Pawnee Gas and Water Department continues to provide dependable service to residents every day.



ANDY LEE
Gas and Water Supervisor

Andy began his career with the Village of Pawnee as summer help in 2005 and returned again in 2006. His strong work ethic and commitment to the community led to full-time employment in August 2007. Through years of experience and dedication, he was promoted to Gas and Water Supervisor in 2013.

Today, Andy serves as the village’s main water operator and holds all gas certifications. A major part of his job is identifying and planning projects that replace aging gas and water mains, helping ensure reliable service and long-term improvements for the community. His knowledge and long-term vision continue to guide the department’s efforts to modernize and strengthen the village’s utilities.

Gas and Water Technician

Josh joined the Water and Gas Department in May 2020 and quickly became a vital member of the team. One of his primary responsibilities is responding to JULIE locate requests, where he marks the location of underground gas and water lines to ensure contractors can dig safely without damaging critical infrastructure.

In addition to locates, Josh responds to water leak complaints and gas odor calls from residents, helping address potential problems quickly and safely. Fully certified in the gas department, Josh plays an important role in protecting the community and maintaining the safety of Pawnee’s gas system.



BRANDON JACKSON
Gas and Water Technician

Brandon Jackson joined the Water and Gas department in February 2025, bringing valuable experience from his previous work with the Villages of Jerome and Chatham. His strong water department background has proven to be a major asset to the Village.

Brandon has gone above and beyond the expectations of his role by earning his certified water operator license after successfully passing his EPA exam. He has also recently become gas certified, further strengthening the department’s ability to safely maintain and operate Pawnee’s utility systems. His initiative and dedication to expanding his knowledge have greatly benefited the village and the department.

Yard Waste Disposal

The Village permits its residents to use the burn pile to dispose of yard waste - grass clippings, tree limbs, and shrubs. This specific burn pile, located at the end of North 4th Street, is exclusively available to residents within the Village limits. Residents can access it through the gate. The burn area is near the central part of the property. For a comprehensive list of acceptable materials, please consult Chapter 3-3.1 of the Village Code.

Contact the Village office to request a limb pickup. Limbs must be stacked near the curb.

NEW Municipal Aggregation Program vs. Ameren Rates

In May, the Village will review bids to select a new supplier for the Electric Aggregation program for Pawnee residents. The municipal fixed electric supply rate becomes effective in June, protecting residents for the next 12 months. Residents will receive a letter detailing the program. **No action is needed to remain in the electric aggregation program.**

What you should know if you opt out of the Electric Aggregation Program

- Residents can opt out now through May 2026. It may take one-two billing cycles to be removed.
- Residents will receive Ameren's Supply Rate.
- When a rate and term are announced, residents must opt out each time.
- Residents must wait 12 months to rejoin the municipal electric rate.

Pawnee Food Pantry

Established in 2006, the Pawnee Food Pantry operates as a nonprofit organization dedicated to assisting Pawnee families facing hardship. Each month, the pantry supports an average of 40 families, totaling 130 individuals. Our doors are open every Monday from 11 AM to 2 PM, with additional evening hours from 5:30 PM to 7:30 PM on the third Monday of every month.

Donations of food and household essentials can be placed in designated drop boxes located at UCB, FNB, the Library, the Post Office, and Kreckels. Please ensure all donated items are within their expiration dates.

Commonly needed items include canned fruits and vegetables, pasta, soup, cereal, tuna, macaroni and cheese, personal hygiene products, toiletries, paper towels, dish soap, and laundry detergent.
